Spring Fruit shipments: Weather permitting, we expect fruit trees and berries to arrive the last week in February and other shipments to arrive around mid-March (indicates that selection will arrive on the later shipments). We expect some of the more unusual fruits around the third week in February. Look for updates in our weekly newsletter and on social media.*

TIPS FOR PLANTING FRUIT

- Plant fruit in full sun (a minimum of 6 hours of sun per day).
- Space plants far enough apart to allow for good air movement once they have reached their mature size (this helps prevent fungal diseases).
- Fruit likes good drainage in its root zone. Amend your planting hole with 50% soil amendment (compost, soil conditioner). Your backfill should be 50% your native soil mixed with 50% amendment. Use only soil conditioner (compost could burn them) for amending blueberries.
- Rock Phosphate, Greensand, Kelp, and Azomite are beneficial additions to the planting hole.
- Hold mulch away from the trunk of the plant.
- Water regularly and deeply the entire first year (water twice weekly to the bottom of the root ball), and water during dry periods thereafter (drought can compromise fruit production).
- Remove any flowers/young fruit the first year, so the plant's energy goes into rooting.
- Weed-eating near fruit tree trunks can kill the plant. Be extremely cautious.
- **Enjoy your delicious harvest!**

Most of our spring fruit shipments will have arrived by around mid-March.
Our next substantial Fruit shipment will arrive in early September 2021.
