The Queen of Vines Just Arrived!



CLEMATIS is called the Queen of Vines and we are stocked up - with over 35 different cultivars of Clematis vines! This gorgeous vine loves to climb up arbors, trees, and whatever it can climb on to show off its flowers. Clematis mixes well with other vines too. Consider planting a climbing rose (arriving mid-April) or Carolina jessamine along with your favorite clematis on a trellis together.

What is their happy place? Clematises likes to have their head in the sunshine and their feet in the shade. So plant in full sun, but shade the roots with flat

rocks or mulch (pulled away from the plant stems). Clematis loves to get a little tonic of kelp meal or liquid seaweed every year. At checkout, request two Clematis Garden Guides: Clematis (also posted on our website) and Clematis Varieties & Pruning.

Deciduous Azaleas



So much WOW! Our selection of deciduous azaleas includes native and hybrid varieties – both will stop you in your tracks.

Some of our in-stock **hybrids** include Klondyke, Gibraltar, Cannon's Double, and Mount Saint Helens.

Native azaleas just arrived – including Pinkshell, Swamp, Flame, Oconee, Coast, and Plumleaf. Scroll down to "rhododendron" in our online shrub <u>inventory</u> for pictures.

Most deciduous azaleas prefer part shade (check the plant tag for particulars), and they all enjoy humus-rich, moist well-drained soil. Good drainage is key. Dig a nice wide hole and amend your clay soil by 50% with compost – mixed well with your native soil. Plant a few inches high of the surrounding soil, and mound your backfill up to cover any exposed rootball.

Do you have established asparagus? It's time to fertilize them!




Worried about damaged plants?
